Unaccompanied Minors Policy



Some airlines have very strict policies regarding who they consider too young to fly alone. United and American Airlines will <u>NOT</u> accept minors if they are taking a connecting flight and travelling without an adult. On every American air carrier, <u>children need to be at least 15 years old to fly as unaccompanied minors</u>. Delta is the only airline that will allow a minor a connection as long as it is <u>on a code share flight</u>.

Students between the age of 5 and 14 may travel on these airlines as long as they follow the prescribed rules and pay a \$150 (USD) fee to the airline for an unaccompanied minor service.

In addition, PLUS will need to schedule a staff member to wait with them at the airport and then transfer that staff member back home, meaning an additional fee will be incurred on top of the airline fee.
