Bath

Fashion Museum – Bath

The museum holds a world-class collection of contemporary and historic dress. Opened in 1963 the museum conserves almost 100,000 objects, ranging from decorated gloves from the time of Shakespeare to fashions by today's leading designers.



Jane Austen Centre – Bath

Bath is a place at the heart of Jane Austen's life and works. The Jane Austen Centre is a permanent exhibition that explores Jane's time in Bath and the influence that this beautiful city had on her books, characters and personal life.



Brunel's SS Britain – Bristol

Discover the ship that changed the world: this former passenger steamship was the longest passenger ship in the world and when launched in 1843 she was called 'the greatest experiment since the Creation'. Designed by I. K. Brunel, she was the great-great-grandmother for all modern ships and was dedicated to the transatlantic service between Bristol and New York.

Cardiff Castle - Cardiff

Cardiff Castle is one of Wales' leading heritage attractions: Cardiff Castle's walls and fairytale towers conceal 2,000 years of history: from the Roman Fort through the Norman conquest's period to the Bute Family in the 1860s



Principality Stadium Tour - Cardiff

One of the most impressive icons of modern Wales. See where the Welsh Rugby Team battle against opponents from across the globe and where the football titans of Europe fought for the 2017 Champions League Trophy.



Oxford Castle and Prison – Oxford

Oxford Castle & Prison explores the 1000-years of Oxford's History. Led by costumed characters, the rich history of the castle with a prison at its heart will be revealed. Climb St. George's Tower and take in the stunning views before descending into the atmospheric crypt, along the 18th century prison wing and into archaic man-made mound.

Christchurch College – Oxford

Christ Church is the essential place to visit in Oxford. Two of its famous landmarks, Tom Tower and Oxford's Cathedral spire, contribute to the city's celebrated skyline. The Hall is a Renaissance splendour which attracted the makers of the Harry Potter films to build a replica of the Hall in their London studios.



Divinity School - Bodleian Library – Oxford

Splendid medieval building and room. It is the oldest surviving purpose-built building for university use, specifically for lectures, oral exams and discussions on theology.



Salisbury Cathedral – Salisbury

Explore over 800 years of history at Salisbury Cathedral, one of the UK's most iconic medieval buildings. Discover one of the only four copies of the original 1215 Magna Carta in the world. See the world's oldest working mechanical clock and admire the fabulous stained glass.
