BA i360 - Brighton

Glide up to 450ft on board British Airways i360. In a fully enclosed glass viewing pod, visitors can admire views across Brighton and the south coast.



Royal Pavilion - Brighton

Exotic palace in the centre of Brighton with a colourful history. Built as a seaside pleasure palace for King George IV, this historic house mixes Regency grandeur with the visual style of India and China.



SEA LIFE CENTRE - Brighton



King's College Chapel - Cambridge

Chapel at King's College in the University of Cambridge. One of the finest examples of late Perpendicular Gothic English architecture.

ArcelorMittal Orbit – The Slide – London

Cutty Sark - London

British clipper ship. Built in Scotland in 1869 for the Jock Willis Shipping Line, she was one of the last tea clippers to be built and one of the fastest, coming at the end of a long period of design development which halted as sailing ships gave way to steam propulsion.



Emirates Air Line – London

The Emirates Air Line is a cable car link across the River Thames in London. You'll discover a unique view over and some of the capital's most iconic buildings and attractions.



Greenwich Planetarium – London

Tour the Universe and explore the wonders of the night sky in the Peter Harrison Planetarium.





Greenwich Observatory - London

Home of Greenwich Mean Time (GMT), the original centre of the world. See clocks and timepieces that have literally changed the world.



Hop on Hop off – London

Hop on/Hop off open top bus city tour. Discover London at your own pace aboard one of the open-top bus tours. You'll see lots of famous landmarks and you will have a unique London experience.



London Dungeon – London

The London Dungeon brings together an amazing cast of theatrical actors, special effects, stages, scenes and rides. It's a uniquely thrilling attraction that will whisk you way back to the capital's most perilous past. See, hear, feel and (ahem!) smell the chillingly amusing characters of the 'bad old days' as they come to life before you.





London Transport Museum – London

Discover the story of London and its transport system over the last 200 years; explore the powerful role that transport has played in the development of the city and in shaping its culture and social history. Part of the tour includes Hidden London: the Exhibition. It takes you on an immersive journey of some of London's most secret spaces in the oldest subterranean railway in the world. Entry is free for students but there is a charge for Group Leaders (minimum one adult per 10 students for safeguarding reasons).



Madame Tussauds - London

Madame Tussaud's waxwork museum includes historical and royal figures, film stars, sports stars, and famous murderers.



Planet Hollywood or Hard Rock Café (meal) – London

Dining experience inspired by the glamour of Hollywood or the rock and roll lifestyle.





SEA LIFE CENTRE - London

Aquarium. Start your visit by walking past an enormous window with incredible views into the magnificent Pacific display. Take a long look at some of the most majestic creatures in the ocean as they swim just inches beneath your feet.



Shakespare's Globe – London

World-renowned performing arts venue, cultural attraction and education centre. The tour will bring the space to life with colourful stories of the 1599 Globe, of the reconstruction process in the 1990s, and of how the 'wooden O' works today as an imaginative and experimental theatrical space.



Tower of London – London

Historic castle founded towards the end of 1066 as part of the Norman Conquest of England. The castle was used as a prison although that was not its primary purpose. A grand palace early in its history, it served as a royal residence, an armoury, a treasury, a menagerie, the home of the Royal Mint, a public record office, and the home of the Crown Jewels of England.





Tower Bridge - London

Combined bascule and suspension bridge crossing the River Thames and built between 1886 and 1894. The bridge has modern exhibitions and a glass floor looking down onto the River.



Warner Bros. Studios – The Making of Harry Potter

Permanent exhibit offering an authentic behind-the-scenes glimpse of the Harry Potter films. Though a self guided tour visitors get a chance to see up close the detail and effort that goes into a major feature film at the scale of the Harry Potter series.



Hampton Court Palace

Royal palace in the borough of Richmond upon Thames. Experience the public dramas and private lives of Henry VIII, his children and 6 wives in the world of the Tudor court. Admire Henry's Great Hall, the infamous Haunted Gallery and the Tudor kitchens. Discover the spectacular baroque palace built for William III and Mary II and the magnificent gardens.





Windsor & Windsor Castle

Visit this beautiful, unique and historic town crowned by Windsor Castle, the family home to British kings and queens for almost 1000 years. It is the largest and oldest occupied castle in the world: Discover the monarchs individual marks, walk through the State Apartments and take in the splendour of the Gothic architecture of St George's Chapel (the venue for Prince Harry and Meghan Markle's wedding ceremony).
