

Filling in blanks can be more than just a quiet, individual activity! Here are some **engaging techniques** to make it interactive and fun for ESL students in class:

1. Team Competition

- Relay Race: Divide students into teams. One student from each team runs to the board, fills in a blank, and then passes the marker to the next teammate.
- Quick-Fire Challenge: Read sentences aloud, and the first student/team to write the correct answer on a mini whiteboard wins a point.

2. Interactive Pair & Group Work

- **Peer Teaching:** Students fill in half the blanks, then swap worksheets and complete the rest for their partner.
- Find Someone Who Knows: Students Walk around asking classmates for help filling in tricky blanks, encouraging speaking practice.

3. Gamify the Activity

- **Dice Roll Blanks:** Assign numbers to different blanks and have students roll a die to decide which one they will complete.
- Mystery Word: Leave some blanks open-ended, and students must guess missing words creatively before checking the actual answers.

4. Digital & Tech-Based Engagement

- Kahoot! or Quizizz: Turn fill-in-the-blank exercises into a live quiz game.
- Interactive Whiteboard: Project the worksheet, and let students come up one by one to drag and drop answers.

5. Role-Playing & Storytelling

- **Fill & Act:** If the worksheet includes a dialogue, have students fill in the blanks and then act out the conversation.
- **Create a Story:** After completing the blanks, students extend the sentences into a short story.
