Type: Supplementary course

Length: 2 lessons a week (1.5 hours / lesson) – on top of the base course

Class size: 15-20 students

Ages: 13 to 17 years old

Levels: B1 and above

Description: The Junior Reporter course is designed for any student who wants to harness their creativity and experience the world of reporting first hand. These interactive workshops offer an exciting opportunity for young people to build and develop an array of life skills, take leadership within their own learning and share ideas and learn from young people around the world. Throughout the various sessions, practical instruction will be given designed to bring theory into practice through guided project work and group discussions. Students will learn about the various styles of communication used in journalism.

Objectives

- Improve English language skills: writing, speaking and listening
- Express ideas and opinions through the production of a variety of communication forms
